Woodstock CE Primary School is committed to supporting Fairtrade wherever possible. Fairtrade is about guaranteeing a better deal for producers in developing countries.

In particular the school will:

- Support the Fairtrade Steering Group
- Ensure that Fairtrade is part of the Raising Achievement Plan
- Use Fairtrade products wherever possible:
 - > tea, and coffee in the staff room and at meetings
 - > in class cooking activities
- Investigate the sourcing of the daily fruit delivery for Reception and KS1
- Explore the possibility of using Fairtrade sports balls in school
- Explore using uniforms made with Fairtrade cotton
- Ensure Fairtrade products are available wherever possible. For example, at events in the school or the community
- Ensure learning about Fairtrade happens in a range of lessons and in whole school Activities
- Promote Fairtrade within the school and wider community, particularly during Fairtrade Fortnight.
